#### Nursery

In Nursery, we have had fun reading the story of Elmer, the colourful elephant. We have been busy making Elmer mosaic collages and talking about what makes us special. #### Reception

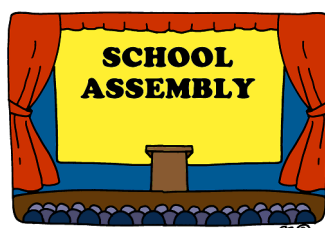
#### Year 5
