****NEW SIGN IN SYSTEM****

You may have noticed that we now have a new sign in system in the school entrance. All staff and visitors are now expected to use it when they arrive and leave the building. This is to ensure the highest level of safeguarding for your children. The system also needs to be used to sign in **children arriving late** in the morning. It is your responsibility to sign them in and give a reason for their late arrival to school. Please ensure that you arrive on time so that your child has the best start to their day.

The system will also be used at the end of the day to sign children out who are **collected late**.

If you are attending a **Parent Workshop** you do not need to sign in using the electronic system. A register will be taken at the start of the Workshop, so we have details of who is in the building at that time.

If you are attending a **Class Assembly** you do not need to sign in using the electronic system. A head count will be taken at the start of Assembly, so we know how many people are in the building at that time. Please wait in the reception area to be collected and taken to Assembly.

If you are visiting for a **meeting** with a member of staff, please use the electronic system to sign in.

Nursery

Reminder that it is the May Bank Holiday on Monday 7th May and school will be closed.

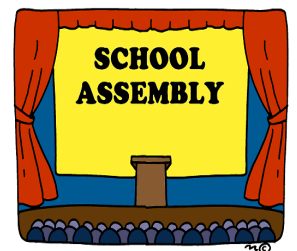
