

Free nursery places for 3 and 4 year olds

From September 2017 parents working more than 16 hours a week (and earning more than £120) will be able to get up to 30 hours of free childcare a week.


At Pooles Park, we are offering full time nursery places of 32.5 hours per week for every child – that's 9am – 3.30pm, Monday – Friday.

You may qualify for this free childcare if

- You and your partner work more than 16 hours a week
- You each earn at least £120 a week (or £112.80 if under 24)
- You are using this free childcare to help you work
- You are on maternity or paternity leave, or statutory sick leave
- One parent is working, and the other can't either through disability or caring responsibilities
- If you are newly self-employed

You will not qualify if

- Either you or your partner earn more than £100,000
- Either parent is a non-EEA national and subject to immigration control



How to apply

You can apply now on the Childcare Service by following these steps:

1.

Get a ‘government gateway’ account.

You can get this by going to <https://www.gov.uk/government-gateway>
Please make sure you have name, date of birth, national insurance number and email address for both you and your partner.

2.

Get a DERN number

Once you have a government gateway account, you can check eligibility and apply for a DERN number (an 11-digit code) by going to: <https://childcare-support.tax.service.gov.uk/>

To apply, you will need:

- Full names (of both parents)
- Date of birth (for both parents)
- National insurance number (for both parents) – or (if you are self-employed) a unique taxpayers reference number
- Your gateway username and password
- Details of ONE of the following: UK passport, tax credit details, P60, or a recent payslip; (for whichever parent set up the Gateway account)
- The dates that both parents started work
- An email address
- A mobile phone

3.

Fill in the ‘Parent Declaration’ form.

Once you have your DERN number, you will need to fill out a ‘Parent Declaration for the free entitlement for 3 and 4 year olds’ form. You can collect this form from our school. Please give your completed form to the school office.
