

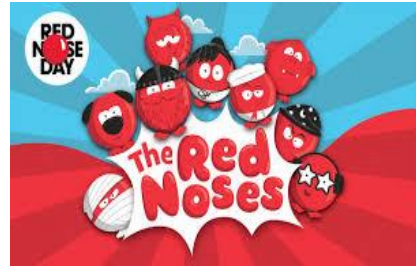

#### Nursery

Our book this week, The Very Hungry Caterpillar, provided links to healthy eating. We tasted some unusual fruit and used different senses to explore fruit and vegetables. The children have been learning how to ask questions - just like scientists. We also enjoyed our Red Nose day activities. Please ask your child to describe how we made the red playdough that they brought home.

#### Reception

We have been scientists to celebrate British Science Week! We have done lots of experiments to do with journeys and have been predicting and describing what happened. We investigated different household liquids travelling down a slope and made comparisons and conclusions. We also recorded information about ourselves for a time capsule that we can open in one year from now to see how we have changed over time.

#### Year 1

This week we have been inventors for British Science Week! We have been thinking about how boats work and testing what material would make the best pirate ship. We experimented to find the boat that could hold the most cubes without sinking! On Friday, Oxford Circus class enjoyed their trip to Hachette Children's Publishers, where they got to explore the offices and ask the employees questions. #### Year 2

As part of the Science Week focus on 'Journeys', Year 2 have been learning about directions including right, left, clockwise and anti-clockwise. We have been making a 3D map of a fairy tale land using paper mache, which the children will use to direct characters to different places. In Literacy, we wrote directions for Jack (from Jack and the Beanstalk) who had got lost on his way home from market!

#### Year 3

We have had a great week doing experiments to investigate how water moves around a plant. We have also been using scientific language and reasoning. Friday was a lot of fun, well done for taking part and raising lots of money. Year 3 have tried really hard in their tests this week, so have a nice weekend!

#### Year 4

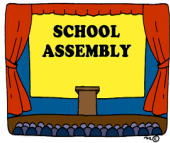
