Nursery

We have continued our food and growing topic and, this week, we focused on a book called ‘Green Eggs and Ham’. The children had great fun making ‘green eggs’ (whisking spinach into scrambled eggs). Reception

Year 1

Year 5

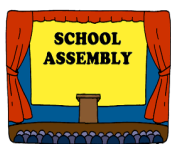
